

*If you are about to withdraw your child from public school, you need to write a letter of withdrawal to the school superintendent, before you become a homeschooler. In doing so, you break the bond with the school district for your child and they are no longer under the school's jurisdiction.*

Here is a sample of what you can write:

"September 1, ----,

Dear Mr./Mrs./Miss/Ms. Superintendent,

Effective immediately, I am withdrawing my child, Jane Doe, from the Your Town Public School District.

Sincerely,

Your Name

Your Spouses Name (optional)"

*This letter may be delivered in one of two ways. Either hand deliver it to the school superintendent's office, and have them sign and date it, giving you a photocopy, or mail it certified mail, return receipt requested. In doing this, both the school district and the new homeschoolers have documentation that the child is no longer enrolled in a public school system.*

*No additional information is required.*
